2. New Boy @ RCH

Sagar became our child in October, 2014. His father is named Mithu Kunwar who brought him here. When his father and he came first at RCH, they both looked very sick. His father is aged 45 whereas Sagar is 11 years old. Both the son and the father cannot speak fluentely and posses identites issued by the government of Nepal for their disability. The mother is not on her consciuosness and her whereabouts are not known. Sagar was working as a dish washer, his father had let him stay at a resturant where he would do dish washing on condition that Sagar would be allowed to go to school. Sagar now is at RCH. Looking at the way Sagar has got along with kids here it seems he doesnt have any disability. When school resume Sagar will be admitted to school and given a chance for a new kind of life here at RCH while his father will get a place to stay here and assist in different works in the field.



Rima, the house mother has been in medical treatment since a month and we've been having shortage of staff in the kitchen. And we've found Bina Ranabhat of Tanahau, aged around 40 years old. She's a single wife after her husband left her and has eversince kept her children in her parents home while she searches for jobs and income opportunities. While she belongs to the same neighbourhoods of villages back in tanahau as Deepak and Ama, Bina's eager to find an opportunity at Rainbow. She is going to be the incharge of the kitchen. We heartily welcome the new member in the family.


Currently the women are learning to weave enthusiastically. They are getting trainings for three hours a day, six days a week. We would like to extend the project to other centres in other districts but will have to focus in this initiative at first. From next month they will start earning their income. We hope working will inspire the lives of the prisoner wth something to do than lie dull behind bars all day and help in the afterlife of their sentences.





5. Academic Progress

Judging on the results of the children of our organization we must say the results of our children education is indeed satisfactory. There are three different schools our children go to based on the age groups they are in. Each school results are usually good. The children's school results of BUDS Academy and National Inventive Boarding school have been published recently. From BUDS Academy Anup B.K., Sujan B.K., Sushil Ranabhat, Shila Karki, Ayush Sapkota, Anjali Nepali, Asha B.K., Sristee Karki, Bidisha Lamichhane, Bibek Pariyar, Kalpana Bogati, Niruta B.K., Anita Ranabhat, Bikash B.K. results has been published and all the children result is satisfactory. Likewise, from National Inventive Boarding school Srijana Rai, Sagar Gautam, Lakchin B.K. and Indrani Dhakal's result have been published and based on the individual capacity of their own. Lakchin scored 1st position with 95.14% in his class and likewise from BUDS Academy Anita Ranabhat has scored 2nd position with 94.4%, Kalpana Bugati scored 5th position with 84.6% and Niruta B.K. scored 6th position with 91.3% in their class respectively which are among the outstanding result this term.





Our children have been building good reputation in our society showing acedemic promise with examplifying results, involvement in clubs and community programs and last but not the least of all demonstrating high moral character with their behaviour. Many organizations invite our children for the participations in different activities like singing competition, games, spelling contest, and many social activities. Recentl,y Deepak B.K. was honored as "Talent Student of school" by "Symbiotic Society of Nepal" and received in form of prize and certificate. He was selected as he had scored highest marks in all the school last year. He is a school topper student too.

Recently Deepak B.K. was honored as the most talented student of his school by the "Symbiotic Society of Nepal", He was awarded a prize and a certificate. Deepak was selected because he scored the highest marks in all his subjects at his school. He is one of the schools top students.



We have birthday parties for all our children in the home every month. The party in May was for Bidisha Lamichhane, Anita Nepali, Sandesh Dhakal, Mahesh Bohara, Asesh Lamichhane, Lachin B.K. Amisha . Similarly in June, the birthday boys and girls included Sanju Nepali, Rabina Rana Magar, Bikash B.K. and Sushil Ranabhat. Likewise in July Ashish Khanal, Asmita Khanal, in August Shila Karki, Bibash Chaudhary, Kalpana Shakari, Amish Giri, Amit Giri and in September Ambika Ranabhat's birthday was celebrated. Birthdays are always celebrated by cutting cake and distributing candies to all the children and staff while the birthday boys and girls get gifts for their birthday.







Rainbow Childrens Home makes sure the beneficiaries get their body checked up twice a year and an annual dental check up . A dental check up was oganized by the Riverside Health Centre, Shyauli Bazaar at the home where some of the children got their teeth taken out and got medicines recomended. also a general health check up is done every year in our home. Dental check ups were performed by Santosh Gurung and his team.

On the 27th of September, 2014 the children of RCH had their full body checked up. The changing seasons brings some health problems and Medicine were also distributed for the children who needed it.





Three of our boys, Kamal Khanal, Deepak BK and Sudip Gautam have participated in a three day training program on Risk Mapping. The purpose of the program is to identify the risky places in Pokhara sub metropolitan city. Kamal and Deepak were in the team for map making and had to mark risky places for different wards in Kaski district. Sudip was in the team who hand wrote what the stakeholder could do to solve the problems as identified risky.

Deepak and Sudip were involved in the making of a one minute film of riskyplaces in Pokhara. Sudip got the chance to act in two of the "one minute movie". These were based on Floods and

Earthquakes while Deepak was part of the directing team. The program was organized by District Children Welfare Board, Kaski and UNICEF Nepal.



10. General Assembly of RCH

On 2nd of August, 2014 we have organized 6th Annual General Assembly. Every year we have to do it. We have invited all the general members, executive and board members in that program. Our Chief Guest was Assistant District Administrator, Kaski, and other guest were Officer of the Social Development of Pokhara



Sub-metropolitan City, Supervisor of Children Development Committee, Pokhara, President of free Journalist Association, Nepal, President of NGO Federation, Member of Nepal Tourist Board, Director of Pokhara Industrial management, President Mother's Group, President of Children Club, Pokhara and Our child Bhumika Chhetry also given a beautiful speech in that annual general assembly. 




Like each year during the festival, Goma and the family began the festival by performing cultural rituals. Kamal who is of the Brahmin caste, becomes the priest of the home and nearby neighbours tying the threads on to others reciting the traditional "mantras" used in the festival Brahmin Caste people are the high cast according to the Hindu caste hierarchy system. Sudip has began keeping the traditions alive by becoming the next priest as his Bhramin caste allows him for the privilidge. In this festival, Goma the director of the house gives TIKA, fruits and money to the children. It is a common culture for Nepalese to use red TIKA on the forhead during festivals where the elders give blessings while putting the colored rice on the forheads of juniors. This festival also marks a brother-sister meeting and exchange of gifts. Almost every Nepalese home eats as special dish of NINE different beans (Pea) called "Quati". At RCH, children enjoyed the nutricious and delicious food in the lunch. Children become happy to get an opportunity to celebrate Janai Poornima at RCH.

We celebrated the Festival, called JANAI POORNIMA (Sacred Thread Festival) at the Rainbow Children Home Nepal on 10th of August, 2014. In this annual festival, it has been a culture in Nepal to get sacred threads from the Bhramins/Priests. There are 6 strings of thread that is tied in the hands and the body.

The chief guest of the program was Senior Officer from Metropolitan City]Department - Pokhara. A jury consisting of retired and school teachers was set up for evaluation the essays. Essays were written in English and Nepali in the both languages. Coordinator of the Essay Writing Jury board was Mr. Surya Nath Adhikari who was former headmaster of Tal Barahi High School while others were Mr. Bikram Poudel (Vice-Principal of National Inventive Higher Secondary Boarding School), Miss Sarada Guruju (High School Co-ordinator of Tal Barahi Higher secondary School) and Saraswati Bhandari (Teacher from Dharmastali School). All those that participated were certified and the winners got the prize from the chief Guest Mr. Om Raj Poudel. RCHN and RHN together organized a Teej Party at RCH on 27th of August, 2014. All the children (boys and girls) together celebrated this festival. Teej is a women's festival but here at RCH we celebrate it with both boys and girls. The Teej party involves rice pudding as the special dish which is called "DARR" in Nepali. In the evening we had party for all the children, an overwhelming singing and dancing party. A feeling, not expressable in words, never understood by any male, what it must be being a female and the festival is just about that thats why the girls enjoy this festival.

Each year at Batulechaur, 12 km awaw from the home there is a carnival for the festival where there are lots of games, sports and song competetions. The children had a visit arranged and took a day to observe the happenings at the place. At school Bhumika and Samjhana participated in the singing competition and got awarded the second prize.



Similarly Radio Janani and the Handicraft Association of Pokhara organized a Teej special market where there was lot of exposure at different women led projects and organizations. Rainbow Handicraft was also for a display. The girls sang on stage and gathered an applause. The eight days of festival also had a fashion show, sports and competitions.





Deepak and his sister Manisha had recently visited their home where their 76 aged grandparents are living. They had been there and celebrated the Dashain festival at their own home. Their grandparents were extremely happy to see them at their house.



Rainbow Children Home Nepal organized a WELCOME program for newly elected President of Pokhara Chambers and Commerce Industry. In this program a former member of Nepal Tourism Board, the General Secretary of Network of Children homes, Kaski and other social personalities were invited. President of Pokhara Chambers and Commerce Mr. Bindu Kumar Thapa and his team visited our home. Our children sang a welcome song for them. We the Rainbow Children home family heartily welcomed them and congratulated the wishing them for their working period, President-ship and other respective posts.

We invited and congratulated the newly elected members of Pokhara Chamber of Commerce and Industry. The program was held in Rainbow Training Centre where the newly elected members gave inspiring words to the children and the children got an opportunity to sing in front of them.









Rima (Asmika) Rai is a house mother of RCH since last four years. She has one daughter about 7 years old, one of the beneficiary of RCHN. Her husband left the after birth of daughter and the whereabouts are still unknown. She was searching for a job for sending her daughter to the school and living life. During that time RCH found her while she was searching for job. She found a job as a house mother at RCH and her daughter Srijana Rai's school admission was done by RCH. Their daughter and mother life was happily moving. But before 3 months her stomach started becoming bigger day by day. We thought she got pregnant so we sent her to the hospital to check up. It was found that she was not pregnant and started diagnosis for her disease. X-ray, Ultra Sound, C T Scan; Blood and Urine tests were done and she was diagnosed with Cancer. According to the CT SCAN Report in her stomach there is large cystic lesion arising from right adenexae and extending into and occupying almost whole of abdominal cavity with enhancing thick septae and solid component with complex right ovarian cyst likely malignant.

We couldnt leave her like that and have started her treatment procedure. According to the doctor's advice chemotherapy was started from 2nd September, 2014. Untill now two dose of chemotherapy has been proceeded and yet another is awaiting next week. After complete 3 dose of chemotherapy doctor will perform surgery and then only they will be able to tell us where we are at her treatment procedure



Tulasha Bogati, joined RCH in June 2010. Her sister Kalpana also came with her at RCH. Now she is 14 years old. She started complaining about her sight which made her difficult to focus during the night. Turns out she had that problem since her childhood. After hospitals and ophthalmologists couldnt diagnose what had happened in Pokhara she had been advised to visit the Tribhuvan University Teaching Hospital in Kathmandu. We had took an appoinnt did some tests and returned back after two weeks for the (GVF and EPG) tests. As advised, we also did the colour vision test and HVF test. After all the reports the eye specialist finally concluded she had the illness since birth. She can see but sometimes she will have problem to read and problem to see small things. Her study program has been highly affected by her eye problem. Doctors have given drops and adviced for an annual visit. The bad news is her vision will start degrading in the future just like Narayani and there is no existance of ways to make it better. But with proper care and doctors advice we hope it slows down and doesnt affect their lives.
