Anyways, things are normal these days in a lot of sense the lockdowns and the drastic measures enforced during covid seems to have gone past their days. It's already been more than two years since we've hardly had volunteers and sponsors visiting us. A lot of activities, donations, help & interactions have thus disappeared and so have individual sponsorships.

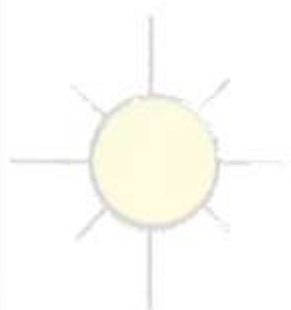
They have moved away from RCH with their relatives. Once they hit 18, we have no control over what they decide, where they stay and what they do.
