



Message From The Director:

Greetings everyone, what a year it has been. Only 8 months ago I was battling my life in the ICU due to severe covid pneumonia and am still in the process of recovery but I am able to take part in daily activities once more. Once more I would like to express I am grateful to the whole community sponsors, friends, volunteers and all the supporters of our organization for the prayers which echoed around the world for me. We are also thankful for the financial support from many of you sent specifically to make sure I got the best treatment here. It helped to cover around 50% of the \$21000 that was spent in hospital as well as arranging everything that was needed for me.

I am glad I am back and thankful everyone and God for letting me breathe again. Breathe, that was what I was finding the most difficult thing to do. But the nightmares over and I approach life in a less stressful way. The organization, the system, the children, it is something very special to us and we will keep our best efforts in making sure the organization does well.

I recently returned back from India two weeks ago but was to be with my daughter who had a spinal surgery. 14 years ago she had an accident and problems in the back started interfering so she had to go through a minimal invasive surgery to cut away sections of the spinal bones which where deformed because of collision. She has to take care for few months until the bones regrow in the original shape and she can have the same strength and flexibility she could have had. All is well.

But probably with the efficacy of vaccinations, and less powerful mutations of the Sars Cov 2 strains, it seems we are on a much better positions overcoming all the fears we had last year. However, we must all also adhere to the guidelines of sanitation and isolation in case of probably contraction.

Yet it is a tragedy when another war has broken out which is going to create humanitarian and economic problems to millions of people for long years to come. And listening to the growing possibility of an all out nuclear war each day is a serious threat to the existence of our human civilization because lets face it, there will be no winner and humanity will the biggest loser if it were to happen so. This was has fueled the Global crises in food, commodities and essentials at a time where there was just first rays of light to respond to global recession had shined. The merits of Globalization are gradually taking more and more casualties and many of the global systems that run the current world are indeed being challenged of being disintegrated. I know its same all around the world but out here to price of food has increased significantly, gas and feul prices have doubled, inflation have been at all time high, so many jobs have gone away, and all economies are taking big hits which isn't really sustainable. And there seems to be more printing of money from the central banks all around the world to deal with the recession. And the end of the day we hope there will be peace, prosperity and happiness all around the world.

A worst tragedy that has happened to us. On the second week of January, Bidhek who liked this name better that what we used to call "Buddhi", who had stayed here was misfortunate to be in an accident which took his life. It was at a time when I was admitted in the hospital in Pokhara due to pancreatitis which I got each time after a week beginning my immune suppressant medication . So I also received the message after number of days. He had recently moved to Chitwan leaving his sewing job in Pokhara to start a family life with his brothers and relatives. Majority of them work at construction sites and as we were informed by his brothers, and his uncle, we wasn't working back then but it was just that day he decided to work there with his uncle and aunt. On the way back from the site, he was sitting on a mixer machine that had adjusted custom seats to adjust for transportation of few workers if need be but wasn't a proper seat or transportation vehicle. In addition, the driver was drunk, had previous record of similar accident, and his driving was so reckless that on an offroad road, Bidhek fell from his sit and was dragged by the vehicle for 50 metres and received very sensitive injuries to his head. He passed away at the gate of the hospital and there was anyone could have done anything about it. We miss him dearly and it's a very heavy heart to write all of this. He had gone Chitwan to start living with his brothers and uncle and aunt and was the key initiator of uniting his family. He was also planning to get married. We can only imagine what it must be going with our dear friend Ro and Tony Costello who had been through all this decade organizing supports but most importantly being there as a grandmother, as a grandmother and as a godmother as she was there all along his side supporting him in any way to make him a moral, responsible, independent adult that he was transforming into. Such incidents cause traumas to us that sometimes changes us for the rest of our lives.



This has been a year of traumas. One thing's true, he is going to be in our hearts and memories for all our lives.

Going back to the current situation in Nepal. These days life seems more normal than it had been since 2019 as businesses are open, events and gatherings have been taking place and statistics report Covid is under control. But business isn't normal anymore and there aren't many tourists around Pokhara. We've hardly had one volunteer. We also understand that at such times recessions happen and it affects globally so we do understand everyone is going through an increased cost of living. Maybe things will improve, lets hope. We haven't been able to do sales or production of handicraft like before, so no women have been working with us eversince. Throughout these years we did have few small orders and have been using up our stocks so we can start with very small production soon with limited women. We will see as there are like 20% than what is used to be. Travel is an important part of the culture so there will be eventually time for that. Also internal tourism has picked up in Nepal where people are more outgoing to different places. But the trend here is young people like to go parties, clubs and fancy places so things like farms and homestays also don't have people coming in. Usually it would be social clubs and organizations but they aren't as active anymore. Any active community members were also affected highly by Covid.
